## How Much Does It Cost?

Many things cost a number of dollars or a number of cents. You must pay that amount to buy something.


You can use different ways to pay. Some people pay with cash. Other people pay with credit cards.

## Your Project Create an Advertisement

Find the price of something you would like to buy. Make an advertisement. Show the item and write the price in dollars or cents. Draw the dollar bills or coins to show two different bill or coin combinations for the item. Write the change you will get if the way you pay is more than the cost of the item.

## Open for Business
